that part of it. Do you...when we look at this, and I'm looking at the two districts that I spoke of earlier, one of them has a mill levy of \$1.19 currently, one has a mill levy of \$1.34, and after speaking with individuals from their district this morning, they're going to have to live with the \$1.05 mill levy under '04-05, least that's what they're projecting it to be, and so they're going to have to live with that. And I'm trying to figure out the...I guess the question I have is when you look at the numbers of the students, as far as being eligible for the incentives, is it based on the '03-04 population, which is the year prior to a consolidation, or is it the prospective enrollment at the newly consolidated district?

SENATOR RAIKES: Senator, I'll check to make sure what I'm telling you is correct, but the way I'm going to answer, the program, in effect, takes place beginning July 1, 2005. So we would use or the student number information would be used that is the most recently available. So each system involved in the merger, you would use that fall membership data for the 2004-2005 school year, and similarly that same information would be used for the merged system.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Okay. The last question you spoke earlier about, that if all the schools that are standard did this it would cost around \$18 million a year, do you know or is there an estimate of how many schools are actually considering such a move that would be benefited by a proposal such as this?

SENATOR RAIKES: I don't have...excuse me, any kind of complete information...

SENATOR JANSSEN: One minute.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...on...or for you on that, Senator. I guess I could probably rattle off three or four that I happen to know about, but...and again, those are sort of...those are sort of in the process of negotiations, the ones I know about. There hasn't been a firm decision at this point.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Okay. And like I said earlier, the only school district that I'm aware of in my area that's formally agreed to
