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do any form of...do any kind of reorganization are the Lodgepole and Chappell schools, and so I'm obviously looking at their situation and whether or not they would qualify under this. Because I think they're the type of schools that you're trying to target, but I'm not sure that they're going to qualify under your amendment. So thank you for your time.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator. Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President. I do have a couple questions, I apologize, Senator Raikes, if he would yield.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Raikes, will you respond?

SENATOR RAIKES: Yes.

SENATOR SMITH: Now I just want to make sure that I have this clear. Basically, if you took a district with 325 students, they would get \$1,500 per student, right, when consolidating with conceivably a school of 78 students at \$3,400 a student? So you'd be looking at approximately \$752,000, \$752,700 for that combined effort. Is that accurate?

SENATOR RAIKES: For a two-year period.

SENATOR SMITH: Spread out over a two-year period,...

SENATOR RAIKES: To be paid over a two-year period.

SENATOR SMITH: ...or that amount times two?

SENATOR RAIKES: No, that amount would be divided over a two-year period.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay. Now are we...are we truly reaching those schools that need to be reached for this purpose?

SENATOR RAIKES: Well, I'll try to respond a little bit. Senator Erdman mentioned two schools in his district. I think both of those schools are either...are either sparse or very sparse. Now the reason that's in our statute regarding school
