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\$36 million,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...if I've got the right number, obligation on this incentive program,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may continue, Senator Bourne.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...there would be a tremendous benefit on the state aid obligation.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It's now your time, Senator Bourne. You may continue.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President. So you're...okay, Senator Raikes, so you're saying that if the schools did consolidate that there would be a benefit to TEEOSA. But then, and I'll tell you exactly where I'm coming from and it's what we discussed on General File, that we constantly are taking money out of the Education Innovation Fund, and what I'm concerned is that the Education Innovation Fund will be consumed into the future with consolidation funds. So you're taking a million dollars today, even though the other areas that are receiving lottery money aren't contributing to this venture, and does that mean that the exposure, and we're going...to the Education Innovation Fund is going to go on into the future ad infinitum, forever?

SENATOR RAIKES: Actually, the way it's drafted, Senator, there's a...the exposure to the lottery money is only for two years, and again this is only a two-year program. And...

SENATOR BOURNE: I understand. But again, if a number of districts obligate or agree...obligate themselves or agree to consolidate, we might have to come up with additional money, and we'll likely have to come up with additional money. And what I'm asking is, is it your intent that the monies come...continue to come out of the Education Fund, or is it going to be through TEEOSA or General Funds or what is your intent?
