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Innovation Funds going into scholarships or grants for the Governor for innovative education ideas and for consolidation. While it's education related, I don't see it, the nexus there. And I see that our exposure...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...is too great here and it seems to me to make sense that...to wait on this. I don't want to see the money continue to be diverted from the lottery. Whether it's from the education side or the environment side, I think we need to stop diverting that money. If we're going to divert it, we should divert it into the General Funds and it should be on an equal basis. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Raikes, there are no further lights on. You're recognized to close on AM3480.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I do much appreciate the discussion, your interest in this idea. I'll try to respond to a couple of the points that have been made and the most recent, Senator Bourne's, the notion that, well, it is a possibility to wait, and he's right, you could. I happen to think that the education lottery monies, it makes sense. This is a use that makes sense. In fact, I would say more than that. It's a very good use of those funds from the state's standpoint. I would also say I think it is important to put this in place now because it is a clear signal to school systems. This is...this requires a significant restructuring. It's only a two-year window. You cannot get this done in a week; so if this is adopted, it's a clear signal to schools that this is going to happen; put yourselves in position, if you have any interest, to see that you can take advantage of this program. If we were so lucky as to have the number of school systems, all the standard school systems participate, yes, it would be an up-front financial burden, but I think the long-term financial impacts to the state would be very, very, very beneficial. So that's a two-edged sword, I understand, but I would hate to argue against the possibility that this program might work well. Now there were a couple other points made
