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Medicaid fraud control unit. Nebraska is one of two states that does not have such a unit. We have a waiver and realistically the only opportunity we have to ensure enforcement and prosecution of those who would fraud our Medicaid system is if the U.S. Attorney's Office would take the case. And so this provides us the opportunity to ensure that the millions of dollars that we're spending in Medicaid are being spent appropriately, that the system is being administered correctly in the eyes of those distributing the funds, but also that those individuals who would be under the system would have an opportunity to have issues of neglect and abuse investigated on their behalf. The substantive changes to the amendment versus the committee amendment; we have created a definition for the Office of the Attorney General to eliminate any confusion that may be out there; we have also gone through and removed any language that refers to the criminal section that was in this amendment. The thought behind that is that there are already remedies under law that we discussed on the last time we spoke and, to remove any concern about that, we authorized the Attorney General's Office to prosecute under existing law. I would then yield the rest of my time, Mr. President, to Senator Chambers, if he would care to use it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, did you care to use the rest of the time?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Erdman. I will not use a great deal of time and a lot of us...well, several of us did do a lot of work...wait a minute. Several of us worked on this. I did a lot of work, I know, and probably others did a lot too, but I won't speak for how much anybody else did. Senator Beutler has found a place in the amendment where it says the Attorney General shall take charge of every case that would come under this statute, and I think that word should be changed from "shall" to "may," and I'd like to ask Senator Beutler a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, would you respond?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, Senator Chambers.
