SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, there are.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And with regard to those, by changing the central statute relating to the age of majority, you may have changed the law with respect to those statutes. Is that not correct?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: You have changed the law with regard to those statutes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. How are we to know which statutes you've changed the law on by changing the central majority statute, unless we have identified to us those areas of life that are affected by your change in the general statute?

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, Senator Beutler, there were, I have previously said--people then thought I was being inconsistent--there were 90-some statutes totally identified as being involved in this work. There were 57...

SENATOR BEUTLER: That was done with a computer run?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...there were 57 that we had to specifically identify and change for whatever reason, but there were 90-some, 92, 95, whatever they were, total.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Do you have a list of the other 97 that were looked at it was decided that they would be changed by virtue of changing the general majority statute?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I do have, sir.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And it's available to everybody, I assume?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: And would you...I'll make it into a floor exhibit and distribute it if that's what you want...would like.
