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education. And that's what we call the former ward program. Under LB 391, there would be an increase in the amount of money that would be available for all former wards, regardless of whether they were, you know, directly involved in this situation as far as the transition or not. But there would be a \$.25 million that would be increased to that program. And that program allows for former wards to receive housing. It allows for them to receive some transportation money. There's a number of other services that they can receive under the law that would be granted to them. And so it is a transition period that does recognize that most young people in the state of Nebraska have family or other resources that they can go to to seek help. However, there are those circumstances where individuals may not have that opportunity, and the state was previously responsible for those individuals, in the terms of some of the services, that we need to be sensitive of in moving forward and making sure that there is funding available for those individuals. The bill was introduced, and did not have a fiscal note until quite a ways after the introduction of the bill. Some have alluded, or made the assumption that the bill was introduced to save money. That is actually not the case. The bill was introduced to correct what I think is an inadequacy in our law. And I think it has to be done systematically, and I appreciate the discussion, and I will continue to be a part of this discussion and to listen to individual members' concerns and try to come up with solutions or answers to them. Because I think if there's questions on their part, I'm sure that there have been questions that have been answered through the Judiciary Committee, as well as through the interim study. But the fiscal note does reflect that difference in law from going from a simple age of 19 to the reality that the services will continue on through an individual graduates, and then taking the additional savings and transferring it into the former ward program. And so like I said earlier, I will go through and do this. But let me speak to the bigger issue here. LB 391 was introduced. We had a legislative hearing. Legislative hearing, individuals came and testified. Most came in support. I think there were a handful of individuals who came in support for their own reasons. After that, the committee said,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.
