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don't need you anymore. (Laughter)

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Okay. Good.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would yield to Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, could Senator Wehrbein yield?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Wehrbein, would you yield?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, I think you got the gist of the question. Can you tell us which sections of the bill we should look at if we wanted to retain the savings?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I can't tell you the sections. I know the areas. It's in Program 347 of our Health and Human Service programs, mostly with child welfare. Let's take the first year of child welfare. And I want to emphasize, these are tentative at this time, because the amendment...these are not perfect figures, because...this amendment. And it is complicated, and I have my light punched to talk about that. But it is in the area of child welfare, foster care, and a very small...well, back up. Child welfare is \$908,000; foster care would be \$114,000. That is the primary impact.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Child welfare and foster care.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: But at the moment you don't know which sections of this bill...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Not in the amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...is relevant?
