SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I would...I could do that. I would have that, but I don't...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Senator, thank you very much. Senator Erdman, could I ask you a couple questions, please?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Erdman, would you yield?

SENATOR ERDMAN: Yes, Mr. President.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Erdman, if you heard the conversation with Senator Wehrbein, can you identify for us exactly which sections of the bill affect, in either...in any way, the fiscal note?

SENATOR ERDMAN: Senator Brashear...or excuse me, Senator Beutler, I believe the sections--and I don't have them by statute reference; I have them by sections in the committee amendment--I believe the sections would be 26, 27, and 28.

SENATOR BEUTLER: 26, 27, and 28?

SENATOR ERDMAN: And I'll have to continue to look. I know that that's generally where those issues start. I'll have to look and see if they continue on beyond 28.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And then my second question to you, your initial interest was in contract law.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Three years ago, that is correct. Three years ago, I introduced a bill, LB 983, that (inaudible)...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And is that still the most important part of the bill for you?

SENATOR ERDMAN: There...I think there are a lot of issues that...my interest, as far as the passage of a change in age, is no longer in one area. I think it can be clearly defined as a benefit to those, based on the original bill that was introduced. But again, LB 391 I think encompasses a lot of other issues, such as...I'll just leave it at that. It is your
