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time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR ERDMAN: But I think there are other issues.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Then let me ask you, the contract law, is that the one that's...is that dictated by 23-2101? Is that the provision that affects contract law? Article 21 of your...on the blue sheet.

SENATOR ERDMAN: I...let me...I would have to double check. And I have my light on, Senator Beutler. So let me double check and make sure that I'm following the same section.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Senator Cudaback,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...I would give back the remainder of my time. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Just like to comment some on this bill. And you know, a bill that contained 5 pages now has 97-page amendment. And I can understand that. That's what happens many times in Health and Human Services. However, there are, on the blue sheet that Senator Brashear passed out, there really are about nine of those chapters that really concern Health and Human Services. And when you look at the fiscal note, that is where the savings are, are on those Health and Human Services areas. And I haven't had the opportunity to personally dig through each one of those. However, I do have some concern that a savings here in this area might turn out to be cost in another area. So...and I haven't had the opportunity to really examine that and work through that to understand how all that might go. This is a very interesting issue, and I think it is one that should be taken up. Should it be taken up with six days left here, on a bill, initially, that was going to examine contracting? And
