bill, so the amendment that you will adopt is by no means the one that Senator Brashear or I would agree should be enacted into law. It serves the purpose of narrowing the scope of the bill. It focuses the bill on trying to do something about when a minor can sign a contract and be bound by it. If we are unable, in the short time we have remaining, to come up with a provision that is legally sound and that is tight in terms of legislative drafting. If we cannot achieve that the bill will not go any further. It will die on Select File. But Senator Brashear and I are willing to bring our legal training. Senator Brashear has much more than I do. I have as much gray hair, almost, because mine has caused me more problems than his has caused him. But we're going to try to see what we can come up with. That's all that I would have to say. And how much time is left?
