April 5, 2004 LB 391

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Erdman, to open on FA1667 to LB 391.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, again, I appreciate your willingness to work through this issue this morning. The amendment that is before you is FA1667. It is on your computer, on your Chamber Viewer. If you follow along, again, it does narrow the scope of what LB 391 intended to accomplish. It does simply narrow it down to the point to where a minor may not disaffirm a contract. Simply read that in the positive: That it would allow a minor to contract but not walk away. We will continue to work to refine this language. It is a very complex issue, I will recognize that, and hope that you will concur that this is a positive step forward and adopt FA1667 and then advance LB 391. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Erdman. You've heard the opening on FA1667, offered by Senator Erdman to LB 391. Open for discussion. Seeing no lights on, Senator Erdman...waives his opportunity to close. The question before the body is, all in favor of adoption of FA1661 (sic) vote aye, those opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Erdman's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion was successful. The amendment has been adopted. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Beutler, may...the amendment that you refiled you withdraw? I have noth...

SENATOR CUDABACK: So ordered.

CLERK: Excuse me, Mr. President. I have nothing further on the bill at this time, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Back to discussion, advancement of LB 391 to E & R Initial. Open for discussion. Senator Chambers, on that motion.
