SENATOR SCHROCK: True.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So a wise person might do that which gives the least amount of pain if there must be some pain at some point. Would you agree?

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If you had to get a bad cavity filled this year or let it go and get a root canal next year, a root canal costs more in terms of money but also in terms of discomfort, which would you choose to do if the choice were yours?

SENATOR SCHROCK: I would do the cavity now.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Members of the Legislature, let's drill out the gas tax, fill this tooth and move the bill on instead of needing a root canal next year. Thank you, Mr. President.
