don't have to give up what they...what you owe them.

SENATOR BAKER: That's correct. They're not going to renegotiate those contracts and lower their incentives. They are going to enforce those contracts if we don't pay them, I suspect. I don't suspect, I...we'll be in court.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: They'll drop the hammer, right?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if the court says, okay, state of Nebraska, you entered this contract, side A has delivered on their end of it, relying on you to deliver on your end of it; you have not delivered, you are in breach.

SENATOR BAKER: That's...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You pay up.

SENATOR BAKER: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. How are you going to pay up?

SENATOR BAKER: That's what LB 1065 solves, is the four plants out there that we've put together is legitimate plants, up and going.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BAKER: LB 1065 funds them though this mix of fees and incentives, of taxes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is this one of the Speaker's superpriority bills?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now he can arrange or govern the order in which amendments are considered. Isn't that true?
