committees to speak out for the laboring people if there are going to be too many on the other side of the issue. Well, what are you for? Do you get your salary as a lobbyist from the dues paid by working people? I have been one of the strongest supporters of labor and their causes on this floor. I now distinguish between working people and organized labor. There is a definite difference. Terry Moore and his henchmen and the lobbyists have more in common with the big shots in business than they have with the ordinary working people. And the working people need somebody to speak for them. Who on this floor other than myself...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...will speak for the working people on this issue? They will never trick me into gagging myself to help them at the expense of the people who have no voice on this floor other than ours. If that gas tax stays on LB 1065, I'm going to do everything I can to kill it, even though it's been named a special high priority bill by the Speaker. He has not named every bill a high priority bill. My own bills will die. Sacrifices must be made, and I'm prepared to make them. And I'm going to look to see if there are any bills that organized labor wants. Not bills that are for the working people, but that would strengthen the hand of organized labor. Strengthen their hand for what? So they can sell out the people even more than they have done? They need to be called to account. Who's going to call them to account?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Nobody.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Hartnett, your light is next.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Madam President, members of the body. Senator Baker or Senator Kremer, right now we have on-line two plants at Hastings, ethanol plants, one at York, one at Aurora, one at Blair, and one at Columbus. Is that correct?
