SENATOR HARTNETT: Is that the only one by LB 536?

SENATOR BAKER: No, we have Husker Ag in Plainview; we have the KAAPA plant at Axtell; we have Trenton Agri Products; and we have the plant at Central City, and I'm not sure what name they're going by. Platte Valley Ethanol Fuels is what I'm being told.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay. So Plainview is a part of this handout that you handed out this morning?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, it is.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay.

SENATOR BAKER: Plainview was in production March of 2003, and it's called Husker Ag Processing LLC, based in Plainview, so.

SENATOR HARTNETT: And then we have (inaudible)...

SENATOR BAKER: And they've been on-line since March of 2003.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Something like nine more plants that may qualify?

SENATOR BAKER: I tell you, I have a list here. If you'd like, I could share it with you off the mike.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay.

SENATOR BAKER: There are 29 applications...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Twenty-nine (inaudible).

SENATOR BAKER: ...as of the 4th of March. Actually, there's 28, and there was one added there, so there's one after that. But 29 applications. Then to further flesh that out, there are...8 have come back and modified their applications to say they're going to begin at 100,000 gallons on an annual basis. So those 8 are scattered around all over the place, all over the
