SENATOR HARTNETT: So they may...the 8 may qualify...

SENATOR BAKER: They have that intention, apparently, Senator Hartnett, yes.

SENATOR HARTNETT: ...for LB 536?

SENATOR BAKER: They have made the effort to come in and modify their contract with the Department of Revenue, yes.

SENATOR HARTNETT: And that's about, what, two point something a year?

SENATOR BAKER: Well, yes. It's a 96-month program, 8-year program, and it begins when they first qualify. So if they would qualify in June of 2004, it's going take them...if they don't have their air quality construction permit, which some of them do, some of them don't, it would take a year or so to get that if everything is organized, and then a year to build the plant. So they'd probably qualify for someplace in the vicinity of \$16 million apiece subsidies.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay.

SENATOR BAKER: That's a rough estimate.

SENATOR HARTNETT: So that's beyond what we have, what we're trying to do with LB 1065?

SENATOR BAKER: Well, all LB 1065 is doing is trying to fund the four plants that are up and going. That's...we're \$42 million short of funding those for the life of the program. LB 1065 in its present form...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR BAKER: ...does provide that funding.
