And it's not going to hurt the people in my district. Labor discriminates against black people. The unions do. Unions are not the friends of black people. Employees will go to their...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...union steward and not be treated fairly. And there's no place they can go. I don't know if Terry Moore is still on the MECA board. I don't know if he's still on the board of Cox Cable, or the one that determines what kind of agreement Cox Cable makes with the city. But he could sing that song, or somebody could sing it for him, of the Beach Boys: round, round, get around, he gets around. He surely does. And the working people get short shrift. This damaging move by Terry Moore to persuade the Legislature to raise the gas tax on poor people is unconscionable, it is despicable, and it is unacceptable. He doesn't need me for an enemy. But if he makes me his enemy, I'm going to let all the people in labor know that it's the fault of the hierarchy of organized labor, because they came down here to raise the tax, the fuel tax...
