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SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...next session, because there is not enough money. Senator Wehrbein's amendment should be adopted. Thank you, Madam President.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Jensen, you are recognized to speak.

SENATOR JENSEN: Madam President, I respectfully call the question.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I see five hands. The question is, shall debate cease? All in favor vote aye; all opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays, Madam President, to cease debate.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Debate has ceased. I'd like to call on Senator Wehrbein to close on AM3554. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Madam President, you said I could close? I want to give a little bit to Senator Hartnett; then I want my time back.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: All right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Please.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Hartnett, you're recognized.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Madam Chairman and members of the body, I had opposed this amendment. But I've been listening in the other room, which I listen a lot better than I do here, is, I'm going to support Senator Wehrbein's amendment. Because what we have been told by people in the ethanol industry, that if you are around an area where there's corn raised, that your price goes up 10 cents a bushel. We're only talking about...then you only get 9 cents. This is not quite as good as owning an ethanol plant, but it's about as good. So I simply wanted to get on
