bill along. But he wants it moved in an inappropriate form. I tell Senator Baker, just get rid of the gas tax, put the checkoff where it belongs, and then let the bill move. But it's obvious he doesn't think the bill is necessary. I don't. If the checkoff has to be \$1.00...I meant a penny and a half, next year, how does that hurt me? It doesn't. Is he representing his constituency? He said some people out there are upset with his position. I don't know who they are. I don't know what position they want him to take. But I know what position I'm going to take here. I'm going to fight against an increase in the gas tax. And I'm going to tell people that Terry Moore cannot deliver votes. He likes to give the impression he can. You know what the labor union, or whatever they call themselves, in Omaha did? Sent me a questionnaire, just because I'm running for office. I don't answer questionnaires. I didn't even respond. So you know what they did? Against my wishes, against my request, they endorsed me. They endorse a sure winner. Then they sent me a paper saying...oh no, they called. Said, you know, let Senator Chambers know he's got until such and such a date to send a picture and a biography. For what? For their little piece of paper? I don't need them. They need me. And Terry Moore has gotten on the wrong side of me, and it's all because of this LB 1065. More is at stake here than a corn checkoff, even than an increase in the fuel tax. Lines are being crossed which cannot be uncrossed. People are stepping into territory from which they cannot withdraw themselves. You ought to think about what you're giving up, and who you're giving it up to...whom you're giving it up to, and what they're going to give in return. They can't give you anything. They can't do anything for you. All they can do is diminish you and feed you some cock and bull story about a big deal that Terry Moore has cut to make sure that all these ethanol plants are going to be built by labor unions. That's the big shot that Terry Moore is--he's guaranteed it. It's cut...the deal is in the bag. And people are buying it. But not I. Terry Moore doesn't talk to me about anything, because he knows I see through him. He's just like one of those window panes. Look right through him, because there's no substance.
