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drafted, would have to be adjusted depending on how many plants came on line June 30 of this year anyway, so I'm comfortable with where we are now with the adoption of the Wehrbein amendment and LB 1065 as it is now. And my sense is, while I certainly would listen to anything Senator Beutler has to offer, I don't think we've done a disservice at all to just go forward with LB 1065 as it is. Senator Wehrbein said it's funded through, I think, 2008 or 2010, and then make some adjustments in the future. So while, again, I'm not opposed to listening at all, I'm comfortable with the way LB 1065 is now and I'll be voting to support its advancement.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Smith, followed by Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President, members. It's interesting to see the amendment up, and I understand the intent and the objective and so forth, but I would say that it's more appropriate for Select File. Given the fact that this very bill is a major proposal, I guess is the proper term, I'm not sure but certainly quite interested in how major proposals are handled. We're approaching a full day at least on this issue and, certainly, if that's the precedent for a major proposal and various amendments being considered and proposed and considered and proposed and defeated and proposed again, it certainly is interesting but, nonetheless, I am interested. And I'll always listen, especially with an issue like this and especially others that are deemed as a major proposal. So I just offer that to the body but, certainly, I think that FA1671 might be better proposed at Select File. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Wehrbein. Is Senator Wehrbein on the...yes, there he is. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I'm going to have to oppose this at this time. I know many wanted to get into the General Fund and this, in essence, is what it does. But I would much prefer to see this bill moved and get into some other things. I believe that, Senator Beutler, I really would ask you if you could withdraw it
