SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Landis, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you. I'd object to the substitution, or we need to do it by a motion.

SPEAKER BROMM: Do you wish to make a motion, Senator Chambers, to substitute?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, actually, I won't substitute. I'll take it the way it is, and then I'll just offer a different amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. With that, did you have an ample opportunity to explain where we're at with respect to your amendment that you're not withdrawing now?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right. No, I didn't say anything about it.

SPEAKER BROMM: Would you like to bring us up-to-date on that amendment, please?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, and I'm trying to get caught up because there was another bill that I thought we were going to look at.
