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What this amendment would do, in line 5 it would strike the period in Senator Bourne's amendment and say the following: "except that no portion of such matching funds shall be provided by the state." The language of Senator Bourne's amendment says, "if the most populous city within the county in which the fair is located provides matching funds equivalent to ten percent of the funds available for transfer." Then there's a complete sentence which follows: "Such matching funds may be obtained from the city and any other private or public entity," and I would add, "except that no portion of such matching funds shall be provided by the state." That is the form of the amendment. If you accept this amendment then I would substitute other language by striking this. If you reject this amendment then I have different one that I'm going to offer, and I think it's clear that Senator Landis and I and "Emperor" Radcliffe are going to take this to cloture. He has said in the paper, or somebody did, that that's what is going to happen. The most votes that this proposal has received was 30. When I talked to some of my colleagues as to why they voted to move this bill, some of them said that they gave a vote to advance it one stage but that they were not going to stay. So I'm prepared to stay on this bill and if it should happen to get cloture then we may not get to it again because there are other measures that will require considerable debate. I can understand Senator Landis opposing my substituting an amendment for this one, because he knows we're in a battle to the bitter end and it will be bitter. This measure is being carried by "Emperor" Radcliffe, who last year or a couple of years ago was paid handsomely to be the lobbyist for the State Fair.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.
