Byars. Here's a question I would like to ask you. Could you turn to page 12 of the amendment?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Byars.

SENATOR BYARS: Can.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The new language in line 22 that I'm going to ask you about mirror-images existing language in line 23. The term is "public members." Do they mean by that term members of the public, or are they talking about parts of a person's body?

SENATOR BYARS: They're talking about members of the public, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Suppose we were to strike "public members" and put "members of the public"?

SENATOR BYARS: I'm not sure it's necessary. But if we felt that we needed to do that to move the bill, I'm sure we could agree to that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I'm not going to say it's necessary to do that to move the bill, but why say "public members"? I haven't seen that...let me say it like this. We have had...

SENATOR BYARS: But that's old language and used...is used all the time throughout this type of statute, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So yesterday's idiocy becomes today's orthodoxy. Is that what you're telling me? That because idiots have been ranging free in the Legislature in the past, I should come along and accept their idiocies?

SENATOR BYARS: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is that what you're telling me?

SENATOR BYARS: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now you wouldn't call this an idiocy,
