SENATOR JOHNSON: A locust is a general term, according to both of the dictionaries we have here, that cicadas, grasshoppers, et cetera, come under the same term as locust, and I think it goes back even in the Old Testament. You probably know more about that than I do that there was the locust...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yeah, I was there...

SENATOR JOHNSON: Okay. (Laugh)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and those locusts were not cicadas then.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute. One minute.

SENATOR JOHNSON: (Laugh) No, they were grasshoppers, I believe.
