additional beds and to increase the hospital reimbursement takes up \$800,000 of that. And we need to eliminate 180 beds, I guess it is, in Norfolk right now, so we're just very concerned that the beds are there, that people are going to be cared for before the regional centers are closed. And we have some extra oversight for that right now, but I would like to say one other thing. There's been a lot of mistrust, I think, on this bill as we've gone through time and...but the people that I've dealt with in Norfolk and especially the employees of the regional center, their number one issue was the care of the patients. It was not their job. It was the care of the patients. I would surely assume they have some concerns for their jobs. But it impressed me very much, when I dealt with them, the issue they always talked about was the care of the patient. And so I hope the rest of you in here understand, those of us that had some concerns, that's where we are. We think the plan is going in a good direction, needs to be done. We just want to make very certain that the patients are going to get the proper care. And with that, Senator Jensen, I thank you for all you've done. And would you like any of my time? Thank you.
