SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you. Hit that right.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Tyson. Senator Jones, on the Jensen amendment.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President and members of the body, I'd like to ask Senator Jensen a question, if I could.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen, would you respond?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, I will.

SENATOR JONES: Yes, I've been supportive of this and I think it's the right way to go, but I guess I want to talk to you just a little bit about the community-based. I have one I think that would qualify in Sargent. I don't know, have you been there?

SENATOR JENSEN: Haven't been there. That's on our tour this summer that we're going to get up there and look at that center.

SENATOR JONES: Well, is your 16-bed pretty solid figured? Can it go over that or how's...how'd you come up with 16?

SENATOR JENSEN: That, the federal government came up with 16. That was their number that they pulled out of the air somewhere, I don't know. But that is the number. That is the one that we have to work with. Now there are ways of if a hospital can have more than 16 and they get rid of that IMD exclusion, providing they have over...in other words, if there's a 100-bed hospital, they could do a 50-bed mental health facility, so that allows them to go over that 16-bed. Other than that, the community-based services must be 16-bed or less.

SENATOR JONES: Well, the reason I brought that up, checking with Sargent just as late as yesterday, they have 18 beds and they're full and they got a waiting list. So they would qualify, but they would have to shut down two of the beds. Is
