CLERK: Senator Tyson, Senator, I have AM3526, but I have a note he wishes to withdraw, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Tyson, did you wish to with...Senator Tyson? It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Brashear, AM3568, but a similar note to withdraw that particular amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Brashear would move to amend with AM3584. (Legislative Journal pages 1518-1519.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Brashear, to open on AM3584. Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the body, in consultation with many of the interested parties who have participated in the entirety of the process with regard to LB 1162, we have agreed to..."we" being an undefined term, we have agreed to further amend with AM3584 that creates a Racial Profiling Advisory Committee. The committee would be chaired by the executive director of the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice, otherwise referred to as the Crime Commission, and the committee shall consist of representatives appointed by the following organizations: the Fraternal Order of Police, the Nebraska County Sheriffs Association, the Police Officers Association of Nebraska, the American Civil Liberties Association (sic) of Nebraska, the Nebraska State Patrol, the AFL-CIO, and the Police Chiefs Association of Nebraska. The purpose of the committee is to advise the executive director of the Crime Commission, in the performance of his duties as a part of analyzing the racial profiling data submitted by law enforcement agencies, and reporting the results of that analysis to the Governor and to the Legislature. This amendment is in furtherance of the purposes of the bill and I would urge its adoption and the
