SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. Now what if that food...or is every vendor there...do they have a license to sell food at another establishment, or is it coming out of people's homes?

SENATOR SMITH: Well, the food would still need to be prepared in a licensed establishment. You know, that might be a church with a license that the fee happens to be waived, because that's a nonprofit organization, or a for-profit organization, or in such circumstances that a home would be approved with a permit and subject to inspection as well.

SENATOR JANSSEN: So there are some that the...that the food inspection service do go into their homes and inspect them?

SENATOR SMITH: I believe so. I would need to double-check on that, but I would say if they meet zoning regulations and subsequently meet everything else, I mean, that permitted facility would be subject to inspection.

SENATOR JANSSEN: What would you say the average vendor there...how many would be from an individual's home or a resident?

SENATOR SMITH: I would say very few, but the Department of Agriculture probably has that on record.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay. So are they there at that event checking the permits that are issued? Is there someone there checking permits?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes, very readily so.

SENATOR JANSSEN: And this is at the same time of the year, most every year? They have a day designated for this?

SENATOR SMITH: Certainly in my district that is the case, and I would speculate otherwise across the state that it would be the same.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay. And generally speaking, it's usually held just once a year, or is it several times during the year?
