amendment is not germane to the Thompson amendment (sic). She cited the rule that said it must be...relate only to details of the specific subject of the bill. It doesn't. The Foley amendment deals with assault of the unborn, but there's also another subject in there that talks about motor vehicular homicide as it relates to the unborn and, quite honestly, I think not only do we have a germaneness rule but we have a single subject problem as well. But that's another story. I will be voting no to overrule the Chair. I think if Senator Foley has some frustration in the fact that his bill hasn't had a hearing, I don't think this is the forum for that. I don't know what to suggest to him to do. I can't tell you why his bill hasn't been heard yet, but I don't have anything to do with that. But I will be voting no to overrule the Chair in the interest of fairness and given the time that we have yet in the legislative session.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Mossey, on the motion to overrule the Chair.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Thank you, Mr. President. Just to pick up on a little bit Senator Bourne and Senator Thompson said, I also will be voting to overrule the Chair. I too agree that the subject nature in which Senator Foley's bill was attached to is not related to the subject matter at hand, and for that reason I will be voting to overrule the Chair...not to overrule the Chair also. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Mossey. Senator Erdman, on the motion to overrule.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Members of the Legislature, I'm going to rise in support of the motion to overrule the Chair, and I recognize that the underlying bill or the underlying issue is one that members would like to see happen, and I also would offer that what Senator Foley is doing is fully within his right as a member of this Legislature. I also recognize that there are those who would rather not have that discussion today, and I think there is one of two ways that you can do that. You can vote not to overrule the Chair and then the issue goes away and we can proceed with LB 943, and in the process of doing that we
