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you what it says, however. It says that they'll pay 60 percent, less an allowance for sales tax paid on building materials, so that you get out of that tax on tax issue. "The allowance for sales tax paid on building materials shall equal the sales tax rate in effect at the time payment is received at the location of the project times forty percent of the sales price for building materials and construction services." It's meant to get at the problem of that argument that there was tax on tax. And I will tell you that subcontractors and contractors support this body of law. There is an area in which there is dispute, and I will raise that when I talk about what I'm going to call the bright line. It's a separate amendment. It's different from this, but it makes incredibly simple deciding whether something is taxed or not. And when that moment comes, I'll explain that idea at a later time.

SENATOR PREISTER: Okay. So the next amendment deals with the double taxation portion. This one deals with a straightforward 60 percent of the total bill that would be taxed. Okay. Thank you, Senator Landis. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Preister. Senator Chambers, now it's your turn.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, we've had such a friendly collegial atmosphere around here this afternoon. Senator Landis ran over me this morning like I was just something out there for road kill, and I expressed my hostility to him. I couldn't get hold of the "Emperor" Radcliffe, because he's in a different realm. Then Senator Foley stood up here and raised everybody's feathers and ruffled fur. But look, the way I am, the facilitator, the mediator, I want to tell Senator Foley, behold, I bring tidings of great joy which shall be unto all people. This bill deals with labor. It deals with contractors. You could call contracting either contracting or contraction. So, since we have a bill that deals both with labor and with contraction, it may be a bill to which Senator Foley's amendment about unborn children would be germane. Labor and contraction relate to birth, and Senator Foley is interested in what happens prior to birth, so he might just want to consider this...what do you call a palm branch of
