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idea which came to us from the contractor community was eventually worked into the idea, into the bill.

SENATOR SYNOWIEC : Getting back to this Revenue Contractor Enforcement Fund, what will be the uses of the funds within this fund?

SENATOR LANDIS: Understand that there is some obligation of the Tax Commissioner, because what they're doing is they are to respond to and decide...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...whether the project is tax-exempt or not. There will be a certain amount of labor that they will have to do in making that determination.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: You know, in the fund...so this will be a cash fund to pay for employees...

SENATOR LANDIS: It will be a cash fund.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: ...to inspect...

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: ...projects in terms of whether or not they are exempt from the tax.

SENATOR LANDIS: Yes.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Solely? I mean, will the fund also provide the Department of Revenue an opportunity to go beyond those that make application for this exempt status?

SENATOR LANDIS: It's...John, I would acknowledge, if you create a cash fund and it spends more money than you use, or you...or you have General Fund source for those, that set of employees that you're using for that function, it winds up creating a cash fund that every now and then the Appropriations Committee...
