SENATOR STUTHMAN: Okay. These are some of the, you know, what I hear out in the field, you know, is this or not. And, yes, you know, we're trying to clarify some of the situations that we've got into in the past year, and hopefully, you know, with some of this good piece of work, as Senator Raikes has alluded to, that, you know, we are trying to do something. But, you know, if we're going to do something, let's genuinely clarify it so that when it comes down to when they deliver that topsoil in and get paid for the topsoil, and I'm responsible for charging sales tax on that, I don't want to be caught in the middle of a debated process. So these are some of the things that, you know, will come up, and I'm sure they will, because this is what's happening out there. So that is the only thing I'm really concerned with right now, but I think I'm going to return the balance of my time back to the Chair. Thank you.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Stuthman. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Landis, I, notwithstanding committee counsel's best efforts, I'm still working on this idea of the allowance. And let me ask you first of all, you described your original amendment and the work up to this amendment as being revenue neutral. This amendment does...

SENATOR LANDIS: And this may not...this would not make it revenue neutral. This has a cost.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, that would be my first question. How much money do we lose with this amendment?

SENATOR LANDIS: Maybe a million dollars.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Pardon me?

SENATOR LANDIS: Maybe a million dollars. If, on the other hand, you...
