SENATOR BEUTLER: And you're estimating a million dollars, your close...your best guess?

SENATOR LANDIS: That's my best guess.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR LANDIS: And you are...you are welcome to try to either strike the amendment or to defeat it. As far as I'm concerned, it's okay by me. It is a situation in which the construction industry says, we regard this as a level playing field.

SENATOR BEUTLER: We regard...

SENATOR LANDIS: You may...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Excuse me. We regard this what?

SENATOR LANDIS: We regard this as the piece that creates a level playing field, and they supported that.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR LANDIS: And given every...all the rest of the pieces that were there, this wound up being in our recommendation. If you don't agree, it's okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Is that piece, the allowance piece, is that basically...how many parts does this amendment have?

SENATOR LANDIS: This amendment has about three.

SENATOR BEUTLER: It has three basic parts.

SENATOR LANDIS: Uh-huh. It has the piece that Senator Stuthman was concerned with, this piece, and I think there's a third, but...so there's...we already did the major one, which was before. This is a...this is not as...there are fewer ideas in this.
