You voted yesterday, and apparently some of you are going to continue to vote that way, to ensure that the constitution will guarantee the State Fair Board money, even though it is failing. It has over \$900,000 in debt. It has no director. There is chaos on its board, and you all, in what I would call your imperial irresponsibility, are saying that without a string attached, without any conditions, this \$2 million which is the estimate will be given to the State Fair Board to spend as it chooses. That is the height of irresponsibility. You all don't want to look at the fact that you are contaminating the constitution. You want to talk about nostalgia and what the fair is doing in other places. An appeal was even made to Grandma, and apparently that swayed some people. Well, I am a Grandpa and I don't think that is a valid basis to contaminate the constitution. I'm going to start for the rest of the session opposing bills that have anything to do with business, whether it's contractors or any other. Why are you going to require them to meet certain standards when you don't require anything of the State Fair Board and you are guaranteeing them \$2 million in the constitution forever? And Senator Brashear stunned me when he voted for it. And what he said this morning lets you know why I was stunned when he cast such an irrational vote. It's irrational for Senator Brashear because he is sane and he can think. For some of my other colleagues who are less well-endowed intellectually, I'm not stunned. It's par for the course. They don't think. "Emperor" Radcliffe can drop the hammer on them and they will do what he tells them to do. I'm not surprised at Senator Landis, even though ordinarily he can think, because it's his city, and he has hooked himself to the emperor's wagon. Actually, it's not a wagon. Whatever you call those chairs that people carry on their shoulders, that's what this is. Senator Beutler does not stun me but he disappoints me; Senator Schimek, the same. Why do I mention people by name, because they boldly and proudly took a public position which is contrary to the rational actions they've played during the time that I've been with them in this Legislature. I have never seen them say that public money, and that's what it is even though it comes from the suckers who play the lottery, public money is going to be given over to a board which is running a moribund
