those tiles out there that pave these halls. I've been walked on all session. I will not even turn on a soccer match, because when I see that soccer ball being kicked around, I feel the soccer ball's pain. Every time a foot contacts that soccer ball, I think of all the feet of my colleagues that have been tromping over me all session. So the paving tiles in the halls that are walked on all day every day and the soccer balls which are kicked constantly receive my empathy because that's what happens to me. The soccer balls must be able to bounce back. The tiles must be strong enough to withstand being walked on and continue to fulfill their function and purpose. Priorities are what we're talking about. Budget bills establish priorities. We've wrangled about some things that are a lot smaller in amounts than what is being guaranteed to the State Fair Board, and some of those items might not have gotten 31 votes on their own. But the "Emperor" said, march, and you all marched. The "Emperor" said vote, and you all voted. And before I forget it, I owe Senator Tyson a heartfelt apology. Senator Vrtiska said sometimes Senator Chambers can be wrong. Senator Vrtiska, you observed this morning a time when I was wrong. I grievously transgressed against the Honorable Senator Tyson. I said, erroneously, that he voted for this State Fair Board's stupidity, and Senator Tyson is not in that number. And Senator Tyson, I humbly apologize to you. But because I transgressed so grievously against you, if you reject my apology, I will understand, and it's no more than I deserve. To accuse somebody of the criminal action that I accused you of is something that ought not be forgiven. So if you don't accept my apology, if you don't forgive me, I understand. Now I've done as much as I intend to do. I'm not going to grovel before you as the body groveled before the "Emperor." I know there are my...I've got colleagues on the floor who feel uncomfortable with that vote, but they gave it anyway because something else was at play that overrode all of their intelligence and understanding. Do you know why they dare not get upset at what I'm saying about this bill? Because they know what they did. They don't care about this bill. The State Fair Board is the top priority. And Senator Landis was clever in telling you all why you ought to have voted cloture, because this is not one of those social issues, this is just transferring money from one pot to the other. But it is a social issue. Suppose you were taking money
