a Class C liquor license, double what it would be in one of these petitions, double. A Class C liquor license is twice as much as what a gambling license would be. Think about that. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Janssen. You've heard the opening on the motion to return LR 11CA to Select File for a specific amendment. Open for discussion on that motion. Senator Schrock, followed by Senator Foley, Senator Brown, Senator Schimek, Senator Beutler, and others.

SENATOR SCHROCK: I give my time to Senator Beutler, if he wants it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, you have almost five minutes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Schrock, thank you very much. Members of the Legislature, I wanted to really work from a chart that's on page 47 of this anonymous handout, which I intended to identify as soon as my light was on as being mine. And if you could turn to page 47, I think you would find this map central to all of the arguments that the proponents are making with regard to this bill. We tend to break down into three categories, I think, in this Legislature. There are those of us who think of gambling purely as another form of recreation and have no objection to it in any form, anywhere, any time; individual choice--the person decides what they want to do; absolute freedom. On the opposite side are people who think it is totally immoral for anybody and everybody all the time, sometimes based on a religious belief, sometimes based on an ideology or a strict moral code. And then there are some of us, and I think it's the majority of us probably, who are in the middle, who don't think gambling is a particularly attractive form of recreation, who think that there is a downside to gambling, that there are some people who are not able to handle gambling well, but who are also pragmatic people and have looked at the facts of the case and said Nebraskans are gambling now. It doesn't matter how we morally feel about it, if they're gambling all over the state now. And not only are they gambling all over the state, but they're gambling at Iowa casinos all
