SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...upset by our allowing these revenues to go across the river.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Foley, on the motion to return.

SENATOR FOLEY: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I am not going to speak very often or very long on this question, but because of the significance of some of the votes that we'll be taking over the next hour or so, I do want to go on record. I, too, am very disappointed that this issue has come back. I thought that we had buried it several times actually this session. But it's back with us, so we'll address it again. I don't think we need to speculate on what casino gambling will do to our state. I think there's enough evidence there, for anybody who cares to look for it, of the personal bankruptcies, the broken families, the divorces, the impoverished people, the small businesses that will go under. All the social consequences associated with casino gambling are very well documented. We've got a compulsive gambling problem in this state that we're not adequately addressing. There's a lot of problems we're not adequately addressing. We just don't have the resources. We do the best we can. And I think this measure, if it does succeed and if the voters do approve it, will only contribute to that problem, and that's a very sad state of affairs. It's amazing to me how the debate on this issue has changed. I haven't been here very long, it's only my fourth year, but when I first came over here the debate was all centered on what can we do to assist the Native Americans, and this, of course, was offered as the great panacea for them. You don't hear about them anymore. What we hear about is need to build up Omaha, this is good for our economy, need to get those Nebraska citizens back on this side of the border, need to balance our budget, this is a great source of revenue, all those
