law with holes as big as a Mack truck going through it so big money can still get into campaigns and they affect the Governor of Louisiana. I don't know. I haven't studied their campaign finance law. But the issue is I want the body to understand what we will have here. We're going to have to raise our contribution limits, our spending limits on...spending and contribution limits, although they're voluntary, supposedly, for our campaigns because there could be a constituency group who wouldn't have enough time to get their contributions in to the candidates. Study other states. You look at the money that goes into campaigns relating to gambling, and it's there. So far we've escaped that. The best form of campaign finance limitation we could adopt here in Nebraska is to say no to Vegas, and maybe a certain expletive in front of no, but I won't go there. We can do better. Nebraska has done well. I could go through and highlight economic development efforts. Let's talk about economic development and bringing money to Nebraska, such as the current riverfront in Omaha, west side of the river, has done by bringing in larger groups. Okay, they might go in a van over to...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SMITH: ...Council Bluffs. We don't have to be like Council Bluffs. We can do better. This is not a moral issue, Senator Beutler, and I know that he's trying to paint this picture that Smith is some right-wing religious zealot. This is economics, friends. This is absolute economics. Those who study it the most, unfunded by casinos, those most independent on the issue say it's bad for an economy, bad. Bankers say it's bad; bankers who know, bankers who...and business people who are typically politically moderate, not some right-wing religious zealot who's never touched a slot machine in his or her life.
