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imagine if the shoe was on the other foot and we had the facilities here in Nebraska, and Iowa was going to have a bill in their Legislature, it would be the same thing. At least they are providing jobs for some of our lobbyists in this state. It's good for the economy. Sure they're going to have to pay taxes on that. And we've shown and we have been shown through surveys, letters, signing of petitions, I believe it's time for the Legislature. We need to take an active role in this. Whether people vote for it or not, that should be up to them. Nothing says that if we get this on the ballot it will be approved. Nothing says the petitions will be approved. But in speaking to people for the last four years about this when Senator Schimek and I started to try to do something to save the Santee Tribe, a little casino operation they had on their reservation which was providing jobs to those people, they were helping their neighbors also. Senator Cunningham can attest to that. What the revenues generated at that Santee little casino...it was like a double garage, two double garage stuck together...the revenues they were generating from that were helping not only the tribe but their neighbors, and that, to me, was where we started. And the argument that every tribe in this state is going to open a casino, that...that is very unlikely. There are a lot of hoops. It won't happen instantly. First they have to form a compact. There are all types of things that they have to do. First, they have to be a recognized tribe in this state. We have two tribes that have casinos in Iowa, a stone's throw away from the Nebraska border, and they are on a busy interstate. I doubt very much if they would want to put one of those in Thurston County. I don't think they would. It's not that they couldn't try. So I think this a fair proposal. We have hashed this over for a couple of years. I don't think we need a lot more debate. You certainly have the right to debate the issue. Think about your constituents. If you're...and if you're convinced that your constituents do not want you to vote for this then I guess you have one thing that you can do. You can express your opinion by voting against this. But if you've had the phone calls, the letters that I've had, I don't...it would be very hard for me to go back to my district and say we denied you the right to have something on the ballot that the Legislature has control of. Be hard for me to do that. I won't know what to say. The only thing I can say
