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is at least I put myself forward and tried to do what you've asked me to do. With that, thank you, Senator Cudaback, for your patience and your indulgence.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Janssen. You've heard the opening on AM3572. Senator Smith, your motion to bracket is out of order. Senator Smith, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. President, I would move to overrule the Chair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith, what point of order are you raising? This is a major proposal. The Speaker does determine the proposals at hand and the motions to be considered, which he has done.

SENATOR SMITH: And I'm simply attempting to overrule the Chair. Can I explain further?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith, the Speaker has determined motions we'll be debating and that would be a motion, so the Speaker would have to determine whether that was a motion to take up.

SENATOR SMITH: Are you saying that a motion to overrule the Chair is out of order.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I think that's what I'm saying.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. Debate on the Janssen amendment, AM3572. Senator Erdman.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Mr. President, I yield my time to Senator Smith.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith, you have almost five minutes.
