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economic sense, I want to come back to that later, because we're losing everything and gaining nothing, because everything happens bad on our side of the river and everything good happens on their side of the river. But let's talk about the good that's happening on their side of the river. First of all, we know that 83 percent of the people who are going over there and spending money are Nebraskans. If you look at that chart again, where the red area is, it says, per capita, \$200 or more every year are being spent over in Iowa. Think of all the people in your neighborhood, Senator Friend. Everyone in your neighborhood, in the whole zip code district, think of everyone of them sending \$200 to Iowa every year. That's what this is telling us. Now if you take the total amount of revenues that are earned by the three casinos in the Bluffs area, again, that's \$381 million. If you assume that Nebraskans didn't go there but went one mile less to a casino on our side of the river, that's \$280 million of revenue that would be going into Nebraska coffers. And if you take the profit figures from those casinos and the taxes that they're paying directly to governmental entities, and if you divide that up by between Nebraskans and Iowans, that would be the equivalent, if we had the same tax system as Iowa, and if our...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...people who are going to Iowa went to Nebraska instead, that would be the equivalent of \$60 million of direct revenues into government coffers. Now that doesn't count a whole bunch of other things. That doesn't count a payroll that would be equivalent to \$250 million and that doesn't account to other benefit...for other benefits in the community. All of these things, these big numbers, all of these things we're losing. And I'll try to talk next time about the arguments of the opposition and why they don't make sense economically.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler and Senator Schimek. Senator Maxwell.
