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Somebody that wants to get something for nothing without working for it. There are, I'll admit, there are some that go just for the fun of it. But it gets to be to where it goes much, much farther than that. As I watch and hear the advertisement for the lottery, I many times think where's truth in advertising?. I mean I've never heard an advertisement that says there's a lot of losers here and I lost a bunch of money. Everyone of those people have made money and they're so happy because that money just flowed in, \$100,000, and they did all this with it and everything. You know for everyone that's lost...or made money, there's got to be a bunch more that have lost it because that money flows out to other places too. We hear a lot of discussion about the lobby. I really tried to think back. I think I've been lobbied by two different...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR KREMER: ...people this year. One of them was a lobby from the Iowa casinos against gambling in Nebraska. That makes me smile a little bit. The other one was a Las Vegas casino lobbying for it. That's all I've had lobbying me. Neither one of those carry much weight with me. If a Las Vegas casino is here lobbying, guess what? Do you think they care about Nebraska? They want the money to go their way and it does. It's not new money. It's not money that's generated from natural resources. It just is not a plus anywhere you look at it. It's devastating communities. I've talked to people from Kearney, from Hastings, saying, are you for expanded gambling if it's going to be in Grand Island? Almost everyone said no because it's going to suck money out of their communities. A study in Omaha said the same thing. It's good...there is economic development in the community but it sucks money out of the rest of the state. Senator Schimek I remember three years ago...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR KREMER: ...asked me to come into her office. Thank you, Mr. President.
