SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith, a little over two and a half minutes.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Senator Schimek. I appreciate that, and let me be very honest with you and tell you that I believe Senator Schimek's motives are very pure and I do not question those in the slightest. I appreciate Senator Schimek's forthrightness, but she brought up the Wal-Mart issue and the issue of Wal-Mart's not needing a vote to operate. And I say I would add to my response that Wal-Mart would most certainly need approval of statewide voters, not just community voters, but statewide voters should they want to perhaps plant a garden in the back and sell what they grow, meaning one corporation cannot engage in production farming in the state of Nebraska due to our State Constitution. Now I don't want to open up that issue for now but certainly I think there's been an effort by some members of the Ag Committee, anyway, to deny the vote or at least even deny looking at information regarding the ability of a corporation, even two neighbors unrelated to each other, to operate in production farming. And so that's something that I wanted to add, so it's not quite as clear-cut as was stated earlier about Wal-Mart or any corporation, as I said earlier, having the ability to operate...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SMITH: ...certain commercial activities regarding the agriculture and other things. But I won't dwell on that. But Senator Beutler pointed out earlier that, gosh, three times on each side of the issue for each motion or each amendment that's up there is certainly reasonable because we have to, let's see, we started at Select File, had to advance to Final Reading. We had to send back to Select File, which I wanted to be a nice guy and help with that effort, so I gave us a green light. And so the issue of more motions needed, okay, let's see, we sent it back to Final Reading, back to Select File, we're trying to adopt the amendment now, and there are other amendments, yeah, it's going to take some time. I didn't design it that way.
