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And I won't even get the last word. That's the sad thing. Even if we haven't done that all my career of maybe the last word here and there that isn't stated in the rules, it certainly took me by surprise that the last word was given earlier just because. But let's talk about the details of a casino. Now we know that a big Vegas casino, the one who wants to come to Omaha, was nailed for \$1 million, \$1 million. Now it was some rogue employees, whatever. Ridiculous. They were rigging their machines. They were rigging their machines beyond their typical take. The machines were rigged so as to accomplish an outcome. That's sad. What I find even more sad are the more subtle issues, perhaps, of placing ATM machines beside slot machines. And in those ATM machines, no, you don't have to use a debit card where it's cash. You can use a credit card. You can accumulate credit card debt at a casino, gambling more money away. Oh, in Missouri they really cracked down, and they said, okay, you can't lose more than \$500 a day, or an hour, one or the other. I don't care what it is. Wow, that's a real safeguard; 500 bucks' loss a day, saying that they were doing it for good social outcomes. Again, let's not be ridiculous. I had a meeting in Las Vegas. I don't take the purist approach and avoid routine meetings just because it's in a gambling town. I went to that meeting, and I noticed the little barmaids, call them jackpot maids, going around selling cigarettes with a tray. They didn't want you to leave those one-armed bandits, the slot machines. And I think I dropped two quarters in, and said...I called it quits after two quarters, to kind of prove a point. But...I lost both quarters, in case you're wondering. But I went to the gym to work out, and I noticed how expensive it was. Why is it expensive? Because they'd rather have you at the slot machines, at the tables, at the roulette wheel. Come on. I thought about going downtown to the school supply store and just getting a basic math workbook, just basic math, to prove a point. I didn't go to a lobbyist about that to provide my materials in fancy copy. But I basically didn't have time to do it. But the basic math, let's do the basic math on the economy. Those folks in the Old Market, closest, I would argue, the closest gift shops, the closest clothing shops to...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.
