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it. I doubt it. I doubt it. Now, these infractions in Vegas came from executives, not necessarily rogue employees. Come on. But I hope I get another time to speak. I know there's concerted effort to shut me down. A nod here and a nod there. Go for that, call the question, shut him off. I try not to lose my sense of humor, so I can laugh at myself here and there. But I hope I get to speak again, because...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR SMITH: ...I want to talk about the new strategy. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Erdman.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is going to be completely out of the ordinary for this body, but I'm actually going to talk about the amendment. The amendment says that after such location has been in existence for five years, a majority of the registered voters of the county shall approve or disapprove the continued presence of such location within the county. And then it inserts the language "and reapproval" after the existing language which talks about the original approval in the Janssen amendment. Now, I remember discussion about this on the last time around. It appears that, for lack of a better analogy, that this would be term limits for casinos. And that is, if you're not delivering, you get a chance to convince everybody that you should stay around. Now, some would argue that that's not fair to them, that's not right. Well, what is the remedy then for the state? Casino such as the one Senator Smith alludes to comes into a facil...or to a location in the state of Nebraska, builds their great facility, says they're going to do all these wonderful things, lower your property taxes, we're going to provide all these extra jobs, which will make minimum wage, by the way, we're going to do all these great things. And a few years down the road, you find out they're not doing any of those things. Senator Schimek seems to believe that their word is gospel, so whatever they think they're going to do, and the voters will be convinced that that's the right thing to continue to do, that the casinos will never be voted out. So I don't know the harm in this amendment.
