down to back to two again, which would be another two-mile interdiction zone if you're going to have them in Omaha. So I think we've ploughed the same ground over again, and for some reason nobody can come up with original ideas. So I really introduced this to see if there is some point in here where there can be some idea that perhaps we can move forwards with this gambling, promote it as an industry, use it for some type of economic development out in the western end of the...of Nebraska. You have to think of that. At the present time, they've been mostly considering using the casinos because all the money that's going to Iowa. And really, you don't even know if your casino is going to be allowed in Douglas County. There's some political people that have indicated they're not for the casinos in Omaha. There's some of the people that have some of the larger corporations in there that have indicated that they're not for it. So just because you have two casinos doesn't mean you're going to have them in Omaha. You might not have them anywhere. They could be over in one of the counties outside of Omaha to the west, so you won't gain a thing. You'll still have people in Omaha going into your Bluffs Run Casino. I think Senator Beutler was the one who put this one pamphlet around there. And if you look, on page 36, on it, it has this big green area of Iowa and Nebraska and everything, with the casino there in the Bluffs Run, from the amount of country that they pull people from. If you'll notice there, it goes clear to the Panhandle of Nebraska there. Imagine putting one of those in the western end of the Panhandle of Nebraska. That would all cover over the whole front range area. That would be outside money. That wouldn't be Nebraska money that you're pulling in from the front range. That would be outside money. This would be from someplace else. This is what you want gambling to do for you. You don't want to take the money away from your local people and your neighbors and your older folks that are on some type of retirement income. You want the outside money to come in someplace. You want the big-dollar people to come in, look around for a day or two, spend a little bit of money, and have a tourist industry along with it, and then go on home, so you don't have to buy their firemen or their policemen and their inner city networks or pay for their water. This is what gambling should be used all about. This is an industry you're talking about. And at the rate we're going with it, you're
