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shutting it out entirely. And besides shutting it out, you're tying the hands of any future Legislature that may come along. You put two casinos in the constitution, and they can't do anything in the future. They'll be tied with that two casinos until they bring it up to a vote. And you can see the convulsions you've went through today to try and get at a vote. Now is it a moral issue? I...some of them have mentioned that it isn't so much a moral issue; it's a money issue. I think Senator Kruse said it wasn't...to him, it wasn't exactly a moral issue. And I'd certainly respect his opinion on that. But nonetheless, when you're just saying you're going to have two, what are you doing with the rest of the state? Are you trying to protect them for something, or are you just telling them to go to, and they're not allowed to have any type of a chance of using this as a tool to further their economic development in the area? This is something that we have to consider very carefully. And I would certainly urge everyone that if you got any rational thinking at all, now is the time to do it. It's been irrational ideas have come across out of this thing, to my notion, for a year and a half now, or these two sessions. And now is the time where we're down to crunch time, I guess. We're going to have to either have something that the people are going to vote for. Are you going to put something out there that they're going to vote for? Or are you going to send a freak out there that nobody wants to judge and have anything to do with? This is what you're doing. You're putting something out there for the state of Nebraska, the people of the state of Nebraska, to judge. So you certainly want to have something worthwhile to judge. If you can't bring something good to the fair, as we were talking, then don't bring it at all. And this is what I think you're doing, without my amendment onto this. The way LR 11CA sits right now, I don't think you have anything that's worth judging. I would appreciate...and I really do think that we should adopt my amendment. And this will give us something to work with in the future, give Nebraska at least a running start to be able to develop a gambling industry that would probably do some good in the whole state, instead of just one or two particular small areas. Thank you, Mr. President.
