would choose to do. So that is a reality. However, Senator Louden does create an interesting question for us. This is it. Do we have the political will in the future Legislatures to say no? Or, as Senator Smith pointed out, we feel that we have an obligation to put in as many casinos as possible and we better limit it to the number of two, otherwise we don't have the political will to stand up and say no. You want to talk about empowerment, give me that latter, give me the...give me the group of people that says no, when it's our right and it's our authority to do it but recognize fully that it's not in the best interest of the state. That's leadership, Senator Friend. Now, I would ask Senator Friend a question, if he would yield.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Friend, would you yield to a question from Senator...

SENATOR FRIEND: Yes, of course.

SENATOR ERDMAN: How you feeling today?

SENATOR FRIEND: Not too bad.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Okay. Can I ask you another question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may... (Laughter)

SENATOR ERDMAN: Senator Friend,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: ...if he yields.

SENATOR ERDMAN: ...would you yield to another question?

SENATOR FRIEND: Yes, I will.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Okay. Fantastic. You are going to support LR 11CA and vote to put it on the ballot and you, I believe, are in the group that hopes that another 29 members do as you do and do put it on the ballot. So you're going to vote to put it on the ballot, correct?

SENATOR FRIEND: I...
