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get into it that they didn't realize would. So I think when you start delegating authority or trying to stop the authority of future Legislatures, I think that's where you run into trouble. If they would have had something else different in there when they set those up, I think this Legislature could have dealt with it a lot easier than what they have, and they wouldn't be worrying about hunting up \$10 million bucks to fund it. The same way with this, with gambling and your casinos. You either treat it as an industry or else you stay clear out of it. If you're going to try and micromanage it from here, you're going to run into certainly a lot of trouble. There's going to be problems up ahead and there will never be a time when they can usually take this thing out and use it for an economic development tool or for a tourist attraction or something like that. I don't know if you...how many of you realize it or not. I don't know how many of you ever go to Denver and the Fort Collins area. I don't know how many of you have seen the amount of population influx into that area. But like I pointed out before when this one circular that Senator Beutler put around there and their Bluffs Run Casino there on the Missouri River, you put something like that Bluffs Run Casino there on the western end of Nebraska and you've covered all of the front range. There's two million people over there that right now they have two casinos up in the mountains and they have \$5 limits on those casinos. So there is something that can be accomplished with doing it, if you do it right, and that's the one thing you want to remember. When you do this, you better do it right the first time because otherwise you'll be sweating it for the next 50 years trying to straighten it out. By giving...whether you give one casino in Nebraska or whatever you allow, that turns the tribal lands...sets them up so they can put the casinos in that they want. So they'll be, if there's a lucrative business out there, the tribal lands will be doing it. They can usually do them a lot better because you will have no control over the amount of payout or how the tribal lands are handled. You also won't get any of the revenue out of those tribal lands, so you want to consider how you're going to do it. Are you going to treat it as a business? Go ahead and put this ballot...or put this proposition before the people and then set up your commission or something like that to control the thing, just like you do any other industry in Nebraska. You've got
